

#### **2022 RobotX Challenge Indigenous Artwork**

Commissioned by RoboNation

Artist: Lee Hampton, August 2022

Title: Technology by Land, Sea and Sky

This artwork represents RoboNation's pursuit to bring young people together, to help solve problems of the world through technology.



In the sky we have a single large logo that represents RoboNation, this is surrounded by a number of meeting places, scattered throughout the sky, each of these meeting places represents the diversity of people from around the World who all come together to participate in the RobotX Challenge. The white journey lines that connect them to each other and also the main sky logo represents them travelling from many parts of the World.

Below this main meeting place in the sky is a trail of white dots leading down to the earth, this represents the journey to Australia.

Through the middle, there is a large section of earth, that appears to be cracked and broken. This represents the land on which we live on, in Australia, which for the most part is a dry Great Southern Land. There are five circles, these are called meeting places. They are interconnected by journey lines.

They all lead to the larger meeting place in the middle that has the RoboNation logo. This represents the central location on where the event is held, in this case, Western Sydney. Bordering each meeting place is a symbol that looks like a double "U" This symbol is an Aboriginal symbol for people, this represents people in their community and also people coming together for the RoboNation event.

The blue section below represents water, the continual circle design, represents the constant movement of water. The marine life is symbolic of the waterways including rivers, lakes and oceans, and is mainly representative of water. Adding the platypus is more symbolic of the river systems in Australia, and as this event is being held in the city of Penrith, our city sits on the banks of the Nepean River, which is known for its platypus habitat. The white section that breaks the land and water, is the whitewash created by robotic marine vehicles that have been created for the RobotX event. These aquatic vehicles are represented by another RoboNation logo in the water, with the whitewash trailing out from the back of the vehicle.

The artwork as a whole, represents bringing like-minded people together from all over the World, to one unique location, in this case, Sydney International Regatta Centre in Penrith, to create opportunities to build careers and solve problems through the use of robotics. Building a better, cleaner future, for a much more sustainable environment.

  - Auto Barn auto parts store







## Traveling to Australia

For each person on your team using the approved RoboNation contact in Australia, please be sure to email the required information to <a href="mailto:autonomy@robonation.org">autonomy@robonation.org</a>, as soon as possible.

- Your Name (As it appears on your visa application)
- Your Team (Name and School/Organization)
- Your role on the team: Team Member, Team Lead or Advisor
- Gender
- Date of Birth: DD/MM/YYYY format
- Country of Origin
- Passport Number
- Country Your Team is Representing
- Accommodations while in Australia (Name of Place and Address)





## Traveling to Australia

- Pack a travel first-aid kit for minor emergencies.
- Be sure all team members have medical information, including medical conditions, emergency medical contact and insurance information.
- If you have any dietary requirements, make a note when you register team members so that caterers can prepare.





## Traveling to Australia

- Bring medications and medical management plans with you; inform RoboNation/DSTG of any special medical needs.
- If you get an anaphylactic reaction to anything, all of your team members must know where your epi-pen is kept.
- Have a medical plan for each team member in case of an unexpected medical emergency.
- If you have a sensory processing disorder or sensitivities or any another neurological condition, let us know what might help you should you become overwhelmed, triggered, etc., so we can be prepared.



## Traveling to Australia

- If you bring medications (prescribed and/or over the counter), you will need a certificate from the prescribing doctor or your regular doctor. Bring a copy of your written prescription with you. You may need it to get your medications through customs at the airport. Check the links below:

- It will be spring in Australia. If you suffer from hay fever, asthma, etc., come prepared and/or familiarize yourself with available over-the-counter Australian medications.





## Traveling to Australia


- If you test positive for COVID-19 while in Australia:
  - Notify your team leader and contact Cheri Koch as soon as possible.
  - Western Sydney confirmed that if a guest tests positive for COVID, they will attempt to move that guest to an empty room, if one is available. If not, the guest would stay in place and isolate. Current COVID protocol recommends frequent testing and isolation until the patient tests negative. There is no requirement to vacate the premises.

## Traveling to Australia

- Prohibited Vehicles: With the exception of mobility devices being used by disabled persons, any vehicles listed as prohibited to be registered in NSW (New South Wales) as deemed by NSW Roads and Maritime Services may not, under any circumstances, be used at the Sydney International Regatta Centre (SIRC). Such vehicles include: motorized foot scooters, motorized human transports (Segways), motorized skateboards.
- Only lead-free solder can be used on the event site (reduce risk of exposure to beryllium).
- Only electric soldering irons may be used on the event site.


